The mentor text "Please Write Back" was used in **1/2G** in planning and drafting friendly letters to special friends and family. Students used the criteria (right) to make sure all the letter parts were included.





strips.








L-R: William enjoying his graphic novel during Read to Self, Zylah exploring the text features of graphica & Will with his draft of his multipanel comic strip.

130th ANNUAL EUROA SHOW:






Resilience, Rights & Respectful Relationships



Our current focus is **Topic 4** of the Resilience, Rights & Respectful Relationships program:

Problem Solving.



Problem Solving is.. Managing our emotions, thinking creatively, and persisting until we find a solution to a problem instead of giving up or getting frustrated.

Conversation starters for families:

Your child can develop their critical and creative thinking skills to explore different types of problems. This can build your child's ability to make responsible decisions that consider the likely consequences of different ways of solving problems.

Foundation students:

Goal: Recognise solutions to problems.

Activity: Come up with three positive and different ways to solve this problem: *You and your family arguing over which show to watch on TV.*

Year 1&2:

Goal: Build collaboration and teamwork at home.

Activity: Using items that are safe and stackable (e.g. paper cups, playing cards), make a tower as tall as you can. Once your tower is complete, remove one item at a time, trying not to make the tower collapse. Or, if you have Jenga, play it together!

Year 3&4

Goal: Identify and evaluate strategies to solve problems.

Activity: Encourage your child to talk to a family member and ask: Tell me about a small problem you faced? How did you solve the problem? If you were faced with the problem again, would you solve it differently?

Year 5&6

Goal: Solve personal problems.

Activity: Discuss this scenario with your child: Your very important homework task is due today, but the internet is down. How would you solve this problem?
