Student Scholarships

The Department of Education and Training administers a number of scholarships that are available to eligible students who are currently enrolled in Grade 4 to Year 12 in 2022. Applicants for these scholarships will be evaluated on their:

- participation in school activities
- community involvement
- academic record for the current year.

Scholarships are either one-off payments or cover the duration of the student's course or annual study. Many of these scholarships have specific eligibility criteria so please refer to individual applications for more information. Applications are open and close on Wednesday 1 February 2023.

For more information and a list of available scholarships, see the 2022 Student scholarships for Grade 4 – Year 12 fact sheet.

Eligibility - Students must be enrolled in Victorian schools and must be Australian citizens or permanent residents. Some scholarships are available specifically to Victorian government school students while others are available to students across all sectors. Scholarships may be targeted to students experiencing financial hardship, and trusts may have particular eligibility criteria.

Can students apply for more than one scholarship? Students are encouraged to carefully identify and apply for all scholarships where they meet the criteria.

How much are the scholarships worth? Grade 4 to Year 11 scholarships are one-off payments between \$300 and \$1,000.

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL SUPERVISION PARENT NOTIFICATION

Student safety at Euroa Primary School is our highest priority and the safe and appropriate supervision of students is an important element of our duty of care to students. Part of this duty is ensuring parents and students are aware of our student supervision arrangements before and after school.

Before school: School grounds are supervised from 8:45am to 9.00am. Before school, staff will supervise all areas near the classrooms and the turf/playground.

After school: School grounds are supervised from 3:15pm to 3:30pm. After school, staff will supervise the drop off gates on Clifton and Anderson Streets.

Students on school grounds outside these times will **not** be supervised (unless they are attending a before or after school care program or supervised extracurricular activity).

Parents/carers are requested to ensure that students do not attend school outside of these supervised times unless they are attending before or after school care, or a pre-arranged supervised activity (i.e. sports practice).

Mathematics



This week teachers have started to collect information about your child's learning in Mathematics and they will continue to build on their assessments over the next few weeks. Students will complete a Progressive Achievement Test (PAT) Maths and a Victorian Curriculum Number



Assessment (VCNA). Student in years F-2 also complete a Maths Online Interview (MOL), with a focus on Measurement and Geometry. This information is then collated and analysed so that teachers can write your child's semester two report. Once completed all of this information is entered onto the Compass report format and will be released to parents towards the end of term.

F/1B = 11/20= 11/241/2G = 15/203/4KW 4/5B = 13/19= 10/225/6P








Keith Haring~ Did you know?
